### Class News

Wrens and Wagtails have had a great couple of weeks learning about The Little Red Hen. We have been playing with the food farm and we talked about how to grow corn. We have also made bread rolls to enjoy like the Hen did in the story.

Robinshave been working hard in their RWInc sessions reading and spelling CVC words. They have made such fantastic progress throughout this half term and should all be incredibly proud of themselves as I know I am. We have also been discussing the transition into our new classroom and thinking about things that will be the same and things that will be different for us all.

Pine Martens have been learning about the classification of animals in science. This week we focused on birds. We learnt that birds have wings, feathers, beaks and can lay eggs. We also learnt the cool fact that most birds have 4 toes. We loved going bird watching and then drawing and labelling some of the birds that we saw.

Hedgehogs have been researching the history of flight. They have been finding out what different things have been invented to fly people safely from one destination to another and sequencing this on a time line to show how this has changed over time.

Otters have been working hard on their science knowledge. They have been investigating sound and instruments. They have had great fun exploring drums and guitars. They have also been creating their own muscial intstruments using their bodies as beat boxes.

Badgers have had great fun making different varieties of chocolate fudge to sell at the Christmas Fair. As well as making the fudge, they worked out costs and created posters to advertise their products.

Foxes' this week have been having PE lessons focusing on dance and following dance routines. We had great fun learning some new moves.
